Modern Slavery Statement

Kuwait Petroleum International Ltd. (the company) is committed to ensuring that there are no acts of modern day slavery within its own business or within its supply chains. We acknowledge our responsibility to the UK Modern Slavery Act 2015 and will work to ensure transparency within the organisation and with suppliers of goods and services to the organisation.

The company is part of a state owned enterprise that provides management and consultancy services to KPI Group and affiliates but it is not engaged in business activities with external customers. We have business relationships with other group companies and with external suppliers of consultancy, training, advisory and management services and we charge fees for our management and consultancy services. The aforementioned is the essence of our supply chains.

As part of our diligence process into slavery and human trafficking, the supplier approval process and procurement related processes will incorporate a review of the controls undertaken by our suppliers. Included in the supplier chain are services from sources outside of the EU that are potentially more at risk for slavery and human trafficking issues, and therefore management resources will be especially focused on those areas.

As mentioned in our Code of Conduct and related ethical business policies including anti-bribery policy, travel policy and others, and reiterated in our sustainability report and CSR guidelines, the company ensures that it is a safe place to work, and it will not support or deal with any business knowingly involved in practices such as slavery and/or human trafficking.

Senior managers have been trained in the subject of Modern Slavery and has been involved in the due diligence process and attending workshops. All other staff have been made aware of the company policy and statement.

The company's directors and senior management will take the responsibility of implementing this policy and will provide adequate resources and investment to ensure that slavery and human trafficking is not taking place within the organisation and its supply chains.

This statement will be reviewed annually and published in our annual report and on our internet site.
